Have an air-tool that's seen better days and leaving you sucking air lately? ### GET THE LEAD OUT – NEW EPA REQUIRED TRAINING

Beginning **April 22, 2010**; **all contractors** performing renovation, repair, and painting projects in homes, child care facilities, and schools **built before 1978** must be certified by the **EPA for Lead-Safe Renovation, Repairs, and Painting**. This law affects any remodeling contractor, maintenance worker, or painter/specialty tradesman. Even a simple renovation such as a window replacement is included under this law. To become certified, contractors must take an eight-hour training course from an EPA approved training provider. Upon completion and the EPA's acceptance of the application, the contractor will receive a certificate, be listed as an approved firm, and will be certified for five years. The four firms in MN that offer this training at this time are M&J Environmental Institute, Midwest Environmental Consulting, Sustainable Resources Center, and the University of North Dakota Environmental Training Institute. Because of the high-demand as there are only four providers, classes fill up fast for these courses. Beware that the courses approved by the MN's Dept of Labor and Industry, do not necessarily qualify for the federal EPA certification. Following certification, contractors must use lead-safe work practices to contain the work area, minimize dust, and clean up thoroughly. They also should provide the owners and/or tenants of the property being worked on a lead hazard information pamphlet and provide documentation of this as well as proof of certification.
